THE Bard meets the Raj at Buxton Opera House later this month.

A star cast is set to take to the stage for three performances of the comic classic Twelfth Night.

While Shakespeare originally set his masterpiece in 17th century Illyria, in this adaptation by The Original Theatre Company the performance has been moved in both time and space to

20th century India.
